

MANDERSTAM CORPORATE EXPERIENCE IN FISHERIES AND RELATED ACTIVITIES

CYPRUS

Development study of sweet-water fish production and processing. This was part of an overall study on the rehabilitation and diversification of the industrial sector after the Turkish invasion, on behalf of UNIDO.

THAILAND

As part of a study on the development of export industries, the potential utilisation of trash fish from the Gulf of Thailand, on behalf of the Ministry of Overseas Development - U.K.

ARGENTINA

The fish-processing activities of the Compania Argentina de Pesca were studied, to isolate those which could be more efficiently carried out at sea. Manderstam then participated in the design of a mother ship, the "Juan Person", to provide the off-shore fleet with these services, which was constructed in the UK and commissioned in Argentine waters.

SCOTLAND

3. Effect on benthic samples and fishing activities of off-shore drilling platforms, sea pipelines and adjacent on-shore activities (urban and industrial).
4. Fishing liaison involves the monitoring of reports by fishermen of debris, oil spills and interference with fishing activities by industrial and other maritime operations. Investigation of fishing methods employed from each port and their seasonal variations to develop changes in routine practices which minimise interaction with non-fishing activities. The monitoring team acts as a channel for advice to fishermen. The work includes liaison and data gathering with Government departments and the fishing communities with regard to changes in catching rates, location of catches and in response to major incidents affecting the fishing industry.
